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1 BLOOM: Good morning, and welcome to the
2 Commissioners' Legislative Session, January 19th.
3 First we'll say our pledge and a take a moment of
4 silence.

5 (At this time, the Pledge of Allegiance
6 was recited in unison, and a moment of
7 silence was recognized by all.)

8 BLOOM: Thank you. First on our agenda this morning
9 is the Approval of the Minutes from January the 12th.

10 PETERS: I want to make a motion that we approve the
11 Minutes of January 12th.

12 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
13 "Aye."

14 PETERS: Aye.

15 BLOOM: Aye. Resolution dealing with attorney

16 designation for Plan Commission matters. Good
17 morning.

18 FISHERING: Good morning. Commissioners, I'm Bill
19 Fishing, the County attorney. This is a repeat of
20 a resolution we've adopted in the past. Basically,
21 as you know since you now are on Planning Commission,
22 Mr. Peters, and you have been, Ms. Bloom, the
23 Planning Commission is a separate body and has it's
24 own counsel. Occasionally our firm does represent
25 people who are at the Planning Commission for various
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1 means. However, all plats are eventually approved by
2 you, typically rezonings. So in those instances
3 which do occasionally happen--I don't remember any
4 last year, but I have--do remember some in the
5 past--where there is a controversy in front of the
6 Commissioners, I excuse myself and ask that you
7 appoint Rocky Finlayson who's also on the County
8 attorney staff but not in our office. He is a
9 well-known real estate lawyer, and that's one of his
10 areas of practice. And for that purpose then, I
11 would ask, so that we can avoid the appearance of
12 conflict, that you designate him should any of those
13 matters crop up during this year.

14 PETERS: All right, I'll so move that we designate
15 Rocky Finlayson in the event that any conflicts of
16 interests would arise related to Planning Commission
17 matters.

18 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
19 "Aye."

20 PETERS: Aye.

21 BLOOM: Aye.

22 FISHERING: Thank you.

23 BLOOM: Thank you. Pharmaceutical Management Service
24 Agreement between Allen County and SUPERVALU
25 Pharmacies, Inc. for the Allen County Jail. Good

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1 morning.

2 BODENHAFER: Good morning. Hi Commissioners, good
3 morning.

4 PETERS: Good morning.

5 BODENHAFER: I'm Chuck Bodenhafer of Bodenhafer
6 Insurance and Investment Group and with Commander

7 Stevens--

8 STEVENS: Good morning.

9 BODENHAFFER: --from the Allen County Jail. What you

10 have before you is the Pharmaceutical Management

11 Service Agreement for your per--or perusal and

12 hopeful signature. We've been working for quite a

13 period of time to come up to this time where we have

14 this actual contract. It's no surprise that pharmacy

15 costs are going up--very, very expensive. And we

16 find that probably the total costs for the jail will

17 range--of course depending upon our exact

18 population--somewhere in the area of \$300,000.00 to

19 \$500,000.00 on an annualized basis. And so this is a

20 very, very large expense. Last year with the help of

21 Bruce Little from the Purchasing Department, we put

22 together a request for a proposal, sent it out for

23 the pharmacy services, and actually received four

24 bids back, reviewed them and made the recommendation

25 that we use the Keltsch SUPERVALU program and the

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1 contract then of which you see in front of you, as

2 being the best of those four contracts. Those have

3 been presented to the Sheriff and for--for his

4 review. And also, his attorney, John Feighner, has

5 reviewed the contracts that you see before you and

6 then has made several changes in that, and--and

7 therefore, you're seeing the finalized version. Just

8 a little background, in order to get those quotes, we

9 actually looked at the top roughly 60 different

10 prescription drugs that were being utilized at the

11 jail. We have worked on many different angles to try

12 to--and from several different fronts, maybe, is a

13 better way to put it--to try to reduce the costs.

14 One of the things that we found in this review is

15 that we were using a lot of bulk prescriptions, and

16 we think that by using blister packs that--

17 individualized drugs, so that they would be able to

18 be returned for those that are not used, will give us

19 substantial savings as well. Dr. Haus who works for

20 us at the jail there has been a great help trying to

21 establish--establish different formularies as well so

22 that we are not using the highest brand name-type

23 drugs if some other medication could be just as

24 effective as well. So we're trying for--through many
25 different means to try to reduce those costs as much
0011

1 that we can. Savings can be generated anywhere from
2 the area of 15 [15%] to 18% to maybe as high as 30%
3 because of all of these changes that we're making, so
4 not just in direct prescription costs, but also
5 reorganizing as well. So I'd really like to thank
6 Commander Stevens and her staff. Vicki Stoneburner
7 has also been of great help in trying to help us in
8 getting all of these quotes as well as helping us in
9 reorganizing so that we can do whatever we can to
10 reduce costs. So--Commander, if you have any--

11 STEVENS: I concur that this has been a--a wonderful
12 event to have us go through this process because
13 it--what it's done, it's not only saving money, but
14 it's also assisting with the staff to provide that
15 service to the inmates as well. So the doctors are
16 happy with it and I--I thank you.

17 BLOOM: Because they're prepackaged?

18 STEVENS: Yes.

19 PETERS: Uh-huh (affirmative).

20 BLOOM: And as far as generic prescriptions, my
21 pharmacy always does the generic--

22 STEVENS: Uh-huh (affirmative).

23 BODENHAFER: We try to use that as much as possible.

24 BLOOM: --unless a name brand is--

25 BODENHAFER: Right.

1 BLOOM: --requested exactly.

2 BODENHAFER: Yes.

3 BLOOM: So this--if this is a huge savings for the
4 Sheriff's Department and the jail, this is good.

5 PETERS: Not to test your memory banks too
6 extensively, but the other bids that were taken, were
7 they local, were they out-of-state, were they--where
8 were they from geographically?

9 BODENHAFER: The four were Summit Medical, Keltsch,
10 that I mentioned which is the one that was selected,
11 Marsh, and a company by the name of OptionCare which
12 is a local--OptionCare is local as well.

13 PETERS: So all of them were essentially local bids.

14 BODENHAFER: Yeah, one of the--one of the things we

15 run into that's a real problem in this particular
16 arena is that it's quite different than the PBM or
17 Prescription Benefit Managers that we would normally
18 look to if--because we need delivery services and at
19 critical times--
20 BLOOM: Right.
21 BODENHAFER: --it's very important for the sufficient
22 operation of the jail that we have deliveries made to
23 the jail that those are very timely--
24 STEVENS: Uh-huh (affirmative).
25 BLOOM: Yeah, yeah.

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1 BODENHAFER: --and--and also we can work--and we do
2 have emergency situations on weekends, etcetera. So
3 it's not your typical request because of the
4 necessity of having the deliveries made--
5 PETERS: Right.
6 BODENHAFER: --to the jail, so--
7 PETERS: Okay.
8 BODENHAFER: --that--that's why you have such a
9 limited number of people that could actually perform
10 the services.
11 PETERS: Uh-huh (affirmative).
12 BLOOM: I think we should have that for employees
13 also. Deliveries.
14 BODENHAFER: Yeah, that would be nice.
15 BLOOM: Don't you think that's a good idea? Great.
16 PETERS: All right. Well, I would move then passage
17 of the Agreement between Allen County and SUPERVALU
18 Pharmacies, Inc.
19 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
20 "Aye."
21 PETERS: Aye.
22 BLOOM: Aye. Thank you very very much.
23 BODENHAFER: Thank you.
24 STEVENS: Thank you.
25 BLOOM: Appointment to the Allen County Redevelopment

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1 Commission. Susan.
2 ELSER: The name before you this morning is Kurt
3 Gutman. This appointment would be effective
4 immediately and run through December 31st of 2005.
5 PETERS: All right. I would so move the appointment

6 of Kurt Gutman to the Allen County Redevelopment
7 Commission.

8 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
9 "Aye."

10 PETERS: Aye.

11 BLOOM: Aye. Appointment to the Property Tax
12 Assessment Board of Appeals.

13 ELSER: The name before you today for consideration
14 is John Thistlewaite. And this would--appointment
15 would be effective immediately.

16 PETERS: I would move the appointment to the Property
17 Tax Assessment Board of Appeals of John Thistlewaite.

18 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
19 "Aye."

20 PETERS: Aye.

21 BLOOM: Aye. Appointment to the Allen County
22 Community Corrections Advisory Board.

23 ELSER: This appointment will take the place of
24 Commissioner Rousseau as an "Other" appointment
25 representative of the Commissioners' Office and that

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1 would be Nelson Peters.

2 BLOOM: I'll make a motion that we put Nelson Peters
3 on the Allen County Community Corrections Advisory
4 Board.

5 PETERS: I don't really know whether it's appropriate
6 to abstain or not--

7 BLOOM: You can't.

8 PETERS: --at this particular point.

9 BLOOM: Just vote.

10 PETERS: Okay. But since there are no other nominees
11 at this point, I would second that.

12 BLOOM: All in favor signify it, by saying, "Aye."
13 Aye.

14 PETERS: Aye.

15 BLOOM: We can vote for ourselves.

16 PETERS: Okay.

17 BLOOM: Okay. Approval of a Joint Powers Agreement
18 between the Wisconsin State Contracting

19 Alliance/NASPRO PC and Allen County for participation
20 in a Purchasing Co-op Group. Good morning.

21 LITTLE: Good morning, Commissioners.

22 PETERS: Good morning.

23 LITTLE: I'm Bruce Little, the Allen County
24 Purchasing Director. I'm asking this morning that
25 the commissioners sign the Agreement that you just
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1 mentioned. It is basically a purchasing cooperative
2 organization made up of state and local government
3 agencies. The primary focus at this time is on joint
4 contracts for the purchase of technology systems like
5 personal computers, printers. Those are the two
6 areas that we are currently taking advantage of with
7 this particular agreement to the greatest extent. We
8 are buying Dell computers off the contract, and we're
9 buying HP printers currently. The contract expired
10 at the end of 2004, so what this is is basically a
11 renewal of an agreement that we were already in. The
12 State of Minnesota is the lead purchasing agency for
13 the contracts that this organization is putting out.

14 So, any questions?

15 PETERS: Well, let me just say that I am delighted to
16 see you continue to pursue these types of agreements
17 because I think where economies of scale are to be
18 gained and we can make some savings based on bulk
19 purchasing, I think we're that much further ahead of
20 the game. So--

21 BLOOM: Absolutely.

22 PETERS: --hats off to you. I would move the
23 approval of the Joint Powers Agreement between the
24 Wisconsin State Contracting Alliance and Allen County
25 for participation in this purchasing co-op.

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1 BLOOM: Ditto. Second. All in favor, signify it by
2 saying, "Aye."

3 PETERS: Aye.

4 BLOOM: Aye.

5 LITTLE: Okay. Thank you.

6 BLOOM: This man saves us money. Approval of
7 Agreement with Koorsen Protection Services for
8 service and inspections on fire extinguisher, fire
9 hoses and semi-annual kitchen fire suppression system
10 at the Jail and Justice Center, cost \$705.00.

11 STEVENS: Yes.

12 BLOOM: And I notice, there was a \$10.00 increase on
13 this.

14 STEVENS: Inflation is a wonderful thing.

15 BLOOM: Uh-huh (affirmative). \$10.00.

16 STEVENS: The--getting someone to come in and work on
17 that hood is always exciting. A lot of vendors--a
18 lot of vendors don't mind coming into the Jail. Some
19 of them are concerned about their employees coming
20 down there to do business, but it worked out well.
21 That's--the people that we've had in the past, they
22 do a good job and I'm happy to have them back.
23 BLOOM: Are these all continuations of--of contracts
24 that we already have? Are there any new ones in
25 here?

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1 STEVENS: No, they are no new ones at all.

2 BLOOM: Are there any increases in cost besides that
3 first one that's \$10.00?

4 STEVENS: The--the changes of--for our contracts in
5 this go around have to do with adding the Justice
6 Center on to the existing contracts that we already
7 have or putting together the maintenance that go
8 along with the warranties throughout the remainder of
9 2005 since the warranties were out in March--will be
10 out in March.

11 PETERS: Which one was that, Commander?

12 STEVENS: Pardon?

13 PETERS: Which one was that?

14 STEVENS: Almost all of them have to do with--

15 PETERS: All of them?

16 STEVENS: Yes--adding the Justice Center to our
17 existing contracts.

18 PETERS: There's--there's one, the approval of
19 service contract extension with ESCO that actually
20 adds the Jail, correct?

21 STEVENS: No, the Jail was already in place. The
22 \$5,052.00 is an ongoing--

23 PETERS: Okay. So that's already--

24 STEVENS: --with the existing equipment. Yes.

25 PETERS: --been there.

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1 STEVENS: Right.

2 PETERS: Okay.

3 STEVENS: And now we're adding the Justice Center.
4 They did the work on that.

5 PETERS: Okay.

6 STEVENS: The warranty and--and the new construction
7 as well.

8 PETERS: I got it backwards.

9 STEVENS: And then at the bottom of--or at the last
10 one--item that you have, 16, that I do not have a
11 price on because that warranty will not expire until
12 July of 2005. And they have not been approached yet
13 to indicate what their--their maintenance is going to
14 be for the remainder of 2005, but I'll be back with
15 that one when I have that information.

16 BLOOM: Okay, so we'll just simply put 16 on hold
17 until you get an appropriate number.

18 STEVENS: Exactly.

19 BLOOM: I think I'm just going to read these.

20 PETERS: Yeah, please.

21 BLOOM: Koorsen Protection Services for \$705.00;
22 MacAllister Engine Power for \$1089.32; Allen County
23 and Shambaugh & Son, \$590.00.

24 PETERS: Wait. Can--can I interrupt for one second?

25 BLOOM: Yeah.

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1 PETERS: You said MacAllister Engine and then you
2 listed \$1,089.00. I think that--

3 BLOOM: I did. Thank you very much. What is the
4 amount on--

5 PETERS: Well--yeah.

6 STEVENS: MacAllister is \$1,243.00.

7 BLOOM: I didn't see that number there.

8 PETERS: Okay.

9 BLOOM: It isn't there. One thousand two hundred
10 forty-three [\$1,243.00]?

11 STEVENS: Yes.

12 ELSER: Yes.

13 BLOOM: Thank you. I--the number wasn't there.

14 ELSER: My error. I apologize.

15 BLOOM: So MacAllister Engine Power is \$1,243.00;
16 Cummins Mid-States Power, \$1,089.32; Allen County and
17 Shambaugh & Son LP, \$590.00; MGE UPS Battery Systems,
18 Inc., \$2,650.00; ESCO, for the Justice Center,
19 \$4,318.00, and the Jail cost, \$5,052.00; IPE which is
20 Industrial Piping and Engineering Corp., \$8500.00;
21 Trane--oh, this one's going to be \$1632.60 a year for

22 three years with no increase. And number 16 between
23 Intergrator and Allen County, we're going to--because
24 we do not have an actual cost--
25 STEVENS: Right.

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1 BLOOM: --we're going to put that off until we do.
2 STEVENS: Exactly.
3 BLOOM: I think we'll just do all of those together.
4 PETERS: Okay, I would--excuse me--I would move on
5 Items eight through 15.
6 BLOOM: Yeah. And I'll second that motion. All in
7 favor, signify it by saying, "Aye."
8 PETERS: Aye.
9 BLOOM: Aye. Approve the Warranty Deed required for
10 additional right of way acquisition on Sumter Drive,
11 Project #03-301. Thank you very much. That's all
12 you had, right?
13 STEVENS: That's all I have.
14 BLOOM: Thank you very much. The Warranty Deed.
15 FITCH: Mike Fitch, Allen County Highway. Good
16 morning.
17 BLOOM: Good morning.
18 FITCH: This is the right of way that is required for
19 the construction of our Sumter Drive project.
20 PETERS: I would make a motion on the acquisition of
21 additional right of way on the Sumter Drive project.
22 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
23 "Aye."
24 PETERS: Aye.
25 BLOOM: Aye. Approve Warranty Deeds required for

0022

1 additional right of way on Dupont Road, Project
2 STP-F340 and Project #00-339, Parcel 2, Parcel 7,
3 Parcel 9, Parcel 14, 16, and 22.
4 FITCH: Yeah, these are right of way for the Dupont
5 Road project. We're about one-third complete with
6 that project.
7 BLOOM: Great.
8 FITCH: We're hoping to complete that right of way
9 and have a bid this summer sometime.
10 PETERS: And, Mike, where are these--
11 FITCH: On Dupont Road--
12 PETERS: --approximately?

13 FITCH: --from Pine Mills to Auburn. It's a section
14 that's two lanes. That project was--programmed
15 it--for federal highway funds and this is the last
16 phase to prepare the project for constructions to
17 acquire all the right of way.

18 PETERS: Okay. I would so move--

19 BLOOM: This is a 80/20 project.

20 PETERS: Right.

21 BLOOM: Yeah.

22 PETERS: Right. I would so move on the approval of
23 Warranty Deeds to--required for the additional right
24 of way acquisition on Dupont Road, Project
25 STP-F340(1) and Project #00-339.

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1 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
2 "Aye."

3 PETERS: Aye.

4 BLOOM: Aye. Approve Supplemental Agreement #1
5 between Misner and Associates and Allen County on
6 Dupont Road from Pine Mills to Auburn Road, increase
7 \$11,950.00.

8 FITCH: This supplement is for the appraisal services
9 on the Dupont Road project. The original agreement
10 when they prepared the fees for the--the appraisals,
11 they go out and inspect the properties and make
12 estimates on what type of appraisals. There's three
13 or four different types of appraisals. They make
14 estimates on what type of appraisals--

15 BLOOM: Right.

16 FITCH: --then when they go out and do the--do the
17 work, they occasionally find that the type of
18 appraisal changes and it requires them to do
19 more--more work in order to complete the appraisal.
20 And that's what happened on this case. The reason
21 for the increase is that there was one additional
22 appraisal added to the project. There were three
23 appraisals changed from a Value Finding to a Long
24 Form, three from a Market Estimate to Long Form, and
25 two--four were changed from Market Estimates to Value

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1 Findings and five from Value Findings to Short Forms.
2 You may not understand, but the--going from a Market
3 Estimate which is the simplest type of estimate to a

4 Long Form which is the most complicated--

5 BLOOM: A lot of additional--

6 FITCH: --may be \$1,000.00 additional fees. So--

7 BLOOM: Yeah, a lot of additional work.

8 FITCH: --that's how the changes take place. So this

9 is the final submittal of his invoice based on the

10 actual work completed.

11 PETERS: Now the--I understand this is an 80/20

12 project?

13 FITCH: This--the right of way phase on this project

14 was paid out of local funds because of the--the cost

15 of the right of way was about \$300,000.00 which is a

16 fairly small amount compared to what we have been

17 spending on right of way. Hillegas Road was over a

18 million dollars and Aboite Center Road is going to be

19 over--

20 BLOOM: Over a million.

21 FITCH: --a million dollars just for right of way.

22 BLOOM: Yeah.

23 FITCH: We only have so much federal funds that are

24 allocated for Allen County and our projects, so we

25 had to make some choices between whether we program

0025

1 this for federal funds or whether we programmed

2 Aboite Center Road. And we felt we'd get more bang

3 for our buck if we programmed Aboite Center Road.

4 BLOOM: Absolutely.

5 FITCH: So we decided to pay this out of local funds.

6 So this 300,000 [\$300,000.00] or this--the

7 acquisition cost and the fees for the appraiser and

8 the buys are coming out of local funds. So this is

9 100% our money.

10 PETERS: So the eleven thousand--was it

11 950 [\$11,950.00]--that will also come out of--

12 BLOOM: Yes.

13 FITCH: Yes, yes. And this amount--we budgeted a

14 little over 300,000 [\$300,000.00] for the right of

15 way and the acquisition. Based on the appraisals,

16 we're going to come in underneath our original

17 estimates by probably 25 or 30,000 [\$25,000.00 or

18 \$30,000.00]. So we're still under what we initially

19 budgeted.

20 BLOOM: Okay.

21 PETERS: All right. I would move approval of a
22 Supplemental Agreement between Miser and Associates
23 and Allen County for Dupont Road.

24 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
25 "Aye."

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1 PETERS: Aye.

2 BLOOM: Aye. Any other business, Mike?

3 FITCH: That's all I have today. Thank you.

4 BLOOM: Thank you.

5 PETERS: Thanks.

6 BLOOM: Susan?

7 ELSER: I have no other business today.

8 PETERS: I would make a motion to waive the second
9 reading on any matter approved today and for which it
10 may be deemed necessary for the Legislative Session
11 of January 19th, 2005.

12 BLOOM: Second. All in favor, signify it by saying,
13 "Aye."

14 PETERS: Aye.

15 BLOOM: Aye. Any comments from the public this
16 morning?

17 FULLER: Commissioner Bloom, I'd just like to bring
18 up that we will be having a public hearing on
19 February the 2nd at the Legislative Session at 10:00
20 regarding the property maintenance code just for
21 public notice.

22 BLOOM: Thank you and identify yourself, please.

23 FULLER: I'm sorry. Dave Fuller with the Building
24 Department.

25 BLOOM: Thank you very much.

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1 ELSER: Commissioner Bloom, I might also add that
2 your Legislative Session next week will be at 11:00
3 a.m. instead of 10:00.

4 BLOOM: We--we have to change that next week. So
5 11:00 next week instead of 10:00. It will be
6 advertised as such. Anything else? Thank you for
7 attending our session this morning.
