1 IRVING: Good morning, and welcome to the Legislative
2 Session on October 25th, 2006. Before we start today
3 we'd like to have the Pledge of Allegiance and a
4 moment of silence.

5 (At this time the Pledge of Allegiance is
6 recited, followed by a moment of silence.)

7 IRVING: Thank you very much. Approve of the minutes
8 of the October 18th meeting.

9 BLOOM: So moved.

10 PETERS: Second it.

11 IRVING: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor
12 say "aye."

13 PETERS: Aye.

14 BLOOM: Aye.

15 IRVING: Aye. Motion approved. Consideration for an
16 application to the Fort Wayne Board of Zoning Appeals
17 for a height variance for the Holiday Inn project.

18 Good morning, Mark.

19 BLOOM: Good morning.

20 ROYSE: Good morning. I'm Mark Royse, Deputy
21 Director--

22 PETERS: Good morning.

23 ROYSE: --of Economic Development. Last week you
24 ratified submitting a rezoning application and a
25 waiver of development application to the City Plan

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1 Commission for the Holiday Inn project across from
2 the Coliseum. Since there's a waiver of the
3 development plan, there is--also needs to be a Board
4 of Zoning Appeals approval to waive the height
5 restriction. The City's height restriction is 35
6 feet. The hotel will be six stories and be 76 1/2
7 feet. We have put together the application, and at
8 this time we're just requesting the Commissioners'
9 approval to submit that to the City Board of Zoning
10 Appeals.

11 IRVING: And that is six stories?
12 ROYSE: Right.
13 IRVING: Maybe you can give us a little bit of a
14 comparison to what that is versus the Memorial
15 Coliseum--
16 ROYSE: Memorial--
17 IRVING: --which is--
18 ROYSE: --Col--yeah, the--
19 IRVING: --across the street--
20 ROYSE: --Memorial--
21 IRVING: --and some of the buildings--
22 ROYSE: --at I.P.F.W.?
23 IRVING: --at I.P.F.--yes.
24 ROYSE: The--the arena at the Coliseum is 140 foot,
25 the A-structures are 150 foot, and the--there's

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1 numerous multi-story buildings at I.P.F.W. None, I
2 don't believe, are six stories tall, but close. The
3 medical science building comes close.
4 IRVING: So this is something that's not--
5 ROYSE: Yeah.
6 IRVING: --we're not asking--
7 ROYSE: As far as--
8 IRVING: --for anything--
9 ROYSE: --a sca--
10 IRVING: --unusual?
11 ROYSE: --as far as standing out or not being to
12 scale with what surrounding uses are, it's not out of
13 character.
14 PETERS: I make a motion to approve the application
15 to the Fort Wayne Board of Zoning Appeals for a
16 height variance for the Holiday Inn project.
17 BLOOM: Second.
18 IRVING: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor
19 say "aye."
20 PETERS: Aye.
21 BLOOM: Aye.
22 IRVING: Aye.
23 ROYSE: Thank you.
24 IRVING: Motion carried. Approval of the 2007 E911
25 budget. Good morning, Judy.

1 HECK: Good morning.

2 PETERS: Good morning.

3 BLOOM: Good morning.

4 HECK: I'm Judy Heck, Allen County Commissioners
5 Financial Coordinator. I am asking for the approval
6 of the 911 budget for 2007.

7 IRVING: The 911 budget comes from the hard line 911
8 fee that is on the monthly bill--

9 HECK: Correct.

10 IRVING: --and it is sent to the County and then the
11 County splits it with the City?

12 HECK: That's correct.

13 PETERS: And New Haven, correct?

14 BLOOM: And New Haven.

15 IRVING: Oh, I forgot New Haven. Please don't tell
16 Mayor McDonald.

17 PETERS: Miss Heck, it's my understanding that we are
18 beginning to lose some fees from 911 based on Vonages
19 and the voice-over-internet deals going around. Has
20 that been taken into consideration in terms of
21 budgeting for '07?

22 HECK: Yes. As far as I can see, 2007, we will be
23 doing fine. We are taking in--still taking in more
24 than what we are budgeting for, so we should be okay.

25 PETERS: What does--and you may not know this, but do
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1 you have any recollection what 2007 looks like versus
2 2006 in terms of income project?

3 HECK: No.

4 IRVING: Maybe we ought to add why that's happening.
5 We know, because more and more young people--and I'm
6 saying "young," between the ages of 18 years old and,
7 I think--is it 30 or 35--statistics show that they
8 are no longer having hard line phones, that they're
9 strictly using their cell phones. And even though
10 you have a 911 fee on your cell phone, that goes to
11 the State, and then the State Treasurer, which is now
12 Tim Berry, he disburses it at his discretion to the
13 different counties.

14 HECK: And we do get that monthly.

15 IRVING: Are they doing it monthly now?

16 HECK: Uh-huh (affirmative).

17 PETERS: Yeah, we get, what--what is it, 80--\$0.80 a
18 month is tacked onto the hard lines for purposes of

19 funding E911. Seventy cents [\$0.70]?
20 HECK: Seventy [\$0.70].
21 PETERS: Seventy cents [\$0.70]. And because there
22 aren't as many hard lines, we're--we're--
23 HECK: Right.
24 PETERS: --losing money.
25 HECK: Uh-huh (affirmative).

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1 BLOOM: And then what it taxed--or tacked onto the
2 cell phones?
3 HECK: I think it's the same.
4 PETERS: But the voice-over-internet, there's no
5 charge?
6 HECK: Right. Right.
7 BLOOM: Right.
8 PETERS: And a lot of people--
9 BLOOM: Right--
10 PETERS: --are moving--
11 BLOOM: --are doing--
12 PETERS: --in that direction--
13 BLOOM: --that, too.
14 PETERS: --as well.
15 HECK: That's true. Uh-huh (affirmative).
16 IRVING: There are some abilities within the statute
17 that you can raise--continue to raise the hard line
18 cost and the cell phone cost, too, so that might be
19 something to consider.
20 PETERS: What I think we probably need to do is go to
21 the Legislature, though, and see if there's anything
22 that can be done with the voice-over-internet
23 charges.
24 HECK: If it's a hard line for the internet service,
25 you know, if it's a dial-up and not Comcast or one of

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1 those--
2 PETERS: Right.
3 HECK: --there's a charge, but if it's one of the
4 other ones, no, there is no charge.
5 PETERS: Right, but it's my understanding, I think,
6 the voice-over-internet programs like Vonage and some
7 of the others are not hard line hook-ups. Okay, I
8 make a motion to approve the 2007 E911 budget.
9 BLOOM: Second.

10 IRVING: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor
11 say "aye."

12 PETERS: Aye.

13 BLOOM: Aye.

14 IRVING: Aye.

15 HECK: Thank you.

16 IRVING: Motion carried. Thank you--

17 PETERS: Thank you.

18 IRVING: --very much, Mrs. Heck. Agreement between
19 Allen County and CommuniTech Services, Incorporated
20 for a voicemail system.

21 BLOOM: Good morning.

22 IRVING: Good morning.

23 COLBERT: Good morning.

24 IRVING: You know, it seems like just yesterday that
25 we went through all the hard line phone companies,

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1 and we found that \$30,000.00.

2 RENTERIA: Yeah, I know.

3 IRVING: Maybe we need to do that again. What do you
4 think?

5 RENTERIA: Well, we do it every month.

6 IRVING: You do it every month?

7 RENTERIA: Yes.

8 IRVING: And we're getting it all? Good. So our
9 system works?

10 RENTERIA: Yes.

11 IRVING: Would you like to introduce yourselves?

12 COLBERT: I'm Denny Colbert and that's Marissa
13 Renteria, and we're from D & M Communications, and we
14 maintain the voicemail system and the communications
15 for the County. What you have before you is the
16 final proposal from CommuniTech Services for the new
17 voicemail, which our voicemail, the existing
18 voicemail has become obsolete and parts are no longer
19 available, so we're looking into a P.C.-based
20 voicemail where parts are readily available without
21 going back even to this company to get parts. And we
22 as D & M Communications, after the warranty is up,
23 will maintain this system as we have three qualified
24 technicians for this system. Also, this system has a
25 transparent change-over. The people who have

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1 voicemails now won't notice any difference.

2 IRVING: Great.

3 PETERS: It's my understanding that you will actually
4 be able to add a number of voicemails to this
5 project.

6 COLBERT: Correct. We can take in, for instance, the
7 Prosecutor's Office, the jury lines, which we pay
8 extra for now--

9 BLOOM: Exactly.

10 COLBERT: --and also human resources' line.

11 PETERS: What is the potential to add to this system
12 should we grow bigger, or, for instance, should we
13 want to co-mingle with the City in the future?

14 COLBERT: This system now is actually a little bit
15 larger than what we will be using, but it is readily
16 adapted to go up in the increments of eight ports,
17 and basically it's--it's just a little more to add
18 later than it is to just start out with the bigger
19 system.

20 PETERS: Okay, so we could really grow the system
21 without--

22 COLBERT: Right. We can almost triple this system in
23 size without purchasing a new base.

24 PETERS: Okay, how--how long--and it's almost a
25 hypothetical question, but how long until a system
0016

1 like this becomes obsolete? I suspect when we went
2 into the last system--

3 COLBERT: About eight to 10 years.

4 PETERS: Really? Okay.

5 BLOOM: With that I'll make a motion to approve the
6 new voicemail system to CommuniTech Services. The
7 project price quote is \$41,303.00, and then we get a
8 trade-in credit of 5,000 [\$5,000.00], so the total
9 would be 36,303 [\$34,303.00].

8 HARTMAN: --N.B.H., yes.

9 ELSER: Commissioners, I have one more also. I'm
10 sorry. Villas of Fiddlers Creek: Bowlander Way from
11 the north plat line to the south curb of the cul-de-
12 sac, 750 feet.

13 BLOOM: I'll make a motion that we approve and accept
14 the following streets for maintenance.

15 PETERS: I'll second it.

16 IRVING: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor
17 say "aye."

18 PETERS: Aye.

19 BLOOM: Aye.

2 so it's necessary for us to reimburse A.E.P., Indiana

5 HARTMAN: Yes, sir, just poles.

6 PETERS: So moved.

7 BLOOM: Second.

8 IRVING: It's been moved and seconded. All in favor
